**Notes:**

1. Four courses may be “double-counted” (IUG) on both the undergraduate (UG) and graduate (GR) transcripts; two of the four must be 500-level or 800-level courses.
2. Every semester, students must complete the “IUG Semester Report,” obtain all signatures and submit to the Graduate School.
3. IUG students must maintain 12 credits to be a full-time student; 15 credits per semester is standard.
4. IUG students should meet with financial aid to verify how many undergrad courses they need to take, but in general should plan to schedule at least 3-6 credits of undergrad coursework each semester to maintain undergraduate tuition; when scheduling courses, undergrad courses should always be scheduled first, prior to graduate courses.
5. IUG students “apply for graduation” at the beginning of their final semester and earn both degrees at once.
